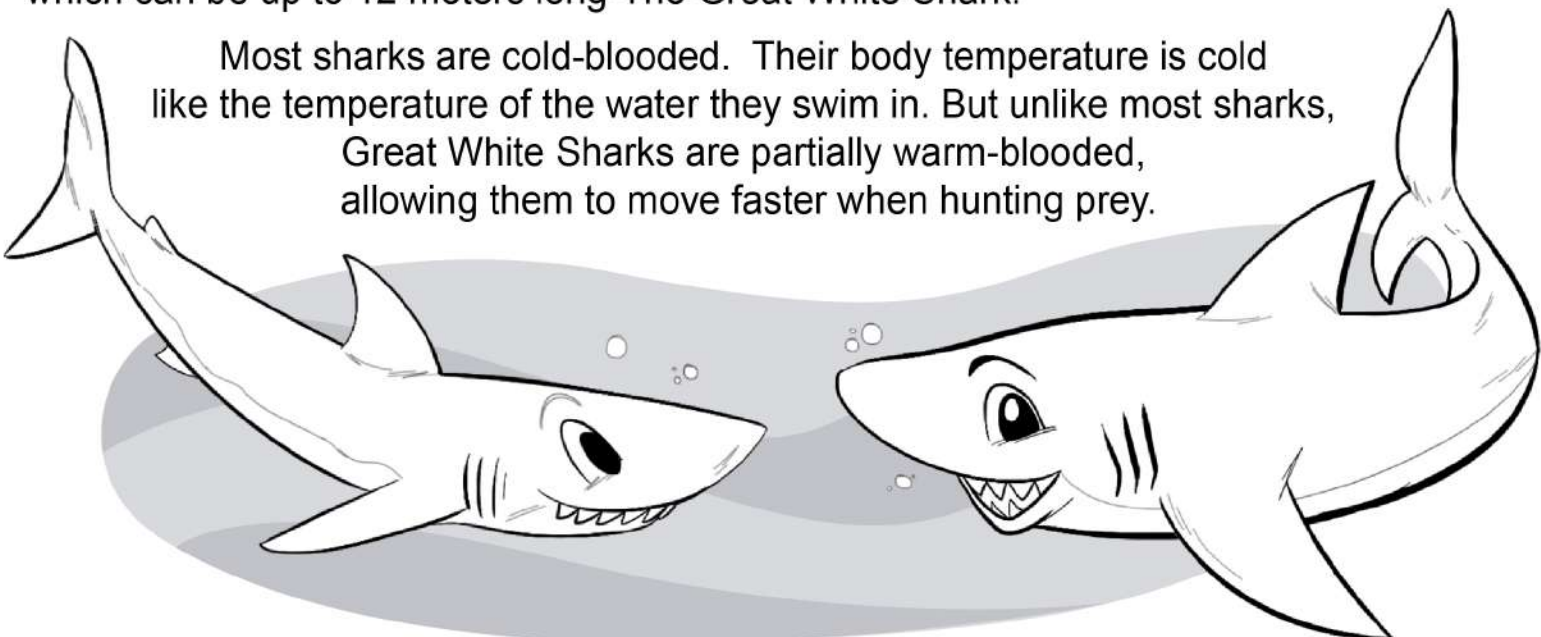
- 2 Toilet paper rolls

- Hot glue gun (optional)
- Black marker
- 1 Sheet of copy paper

Did you know?

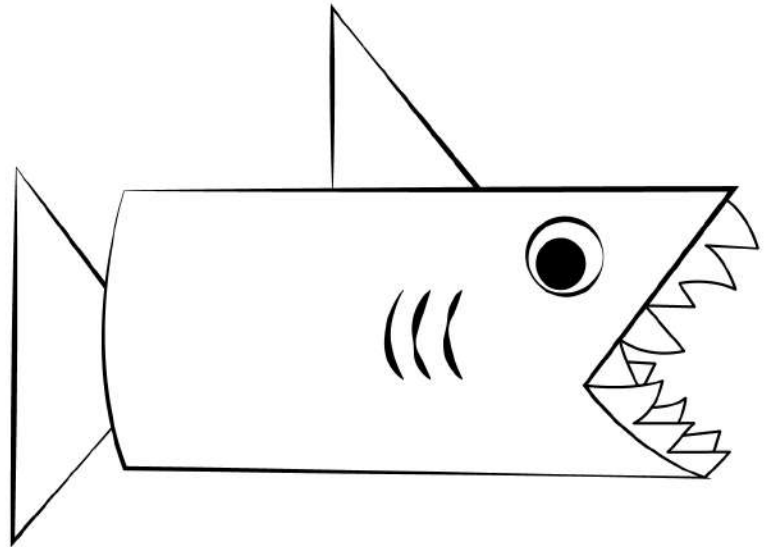
Sharks have been around for over 400 million years-long before dinosaurs. Because their skeletons are made of cartilage (like our noses) instead of bones, they don't leave fossils like other animals – but fossilized shark teeth have been found.

There are over 500 species of sharks. They can vary dramatically in size from the smallest dwarf lantern shark (which is about the size of a human hand), to the largest which can be up to 12 meters long-The Great White Shark.

Most sharks are cold-blooded. Their body temperature is cold like the temperature of the water they swim in. But unlike most sharks, Great White Sharks are partially warm-blooded, allowing them to move faster when hunting prey.

Let's get creative

- 1** First, cut out the "mouth" section by cutting a triangle into one end of the toilet paper tube. Save the leftover triangle pieces for the fin and the tail.
- 2** Paint the roll and left-over triangle pieces and set aside to dry.
- 3** Cut some teeth out of plain white paper and glue to the inside triangle part of the roll (mouth)
 - 4** Use hot glue to attach the fin and tail.
 - 5** Glue one googly eye on each side of the roll.
 - 6** Use Black marker to create the gills.
